2024 Fellowship Wall Repair Project

A large renovation project was completed July 8- July 10, which you may not have been aware of. As you look around the church to figure out where a big, three day project happened, you may not find it.

The needed repairs were to the exterior of the fellowship hall, near the three windows. The demolition and rebuilding of the exterior wall was done to solve leaking around the windows causing rotting of the structure. There were numerous holes in the old coated Styrofoam wall that were occupied by birds.

The project was led by Tom Graf, who analyzed the project and came up with a solution. In addition to the planning, Tom created a project list, went to the building supply store numerous times, and transported the building material to the jobsite.

Tom's crew consisted of Gary L, Rich S, Wayne D, Dave H and Bill K.

The first day's task was to remove all the Styrofoam wall and rotten wood, and then to replace with new wood.

The second day was the hottest, but we were able to fabricate and install custom flashings, apply sealing tape, and moisture block. We were able to start installing the siding.

We completed installing the siding, flashing, window trim, and final caulking on the third day.

We were not quite done yet; Tom returned unused material to the store and the trailer full of waste debris had to be taken to the landfill.

Thank You for all who helped. We are so blessed to have enough volunteers both willing and able to do the job ourselves to save the cost of a contractor doing this job! The cost for material was \$914. The labor cost was Zero!
