St. James, the Apostle

James, son of Zebedee, the first of Jesus' disciples to be martyred, is commemorated on July 25. Killed by sword on the order of King Herod around 44 A.D., James is the only apostle whose martyrdom is recorded in Scripture. Scholars believe he wasn't the author of the New Testament book of James.

Jesus called James, James' brother John and their fishing partner Simon to take up "catching people" (Luke 5:1-11). They soon formed Jesus' inner circle, the only disciples Jesus took along when he was transfigured, when he prayed in Gethsemane and at certain other times.

Jesus dubbed James and John "Sons of Thunder"; did they perhaps have anger-management problems? And the brothers asked Jesus for special status in his coming kingdom, winning themselves no favor with the other disciples. But James' imperfections remind us that God always chooses flawed people — including you and me — to carry out his work!
